BACKGROUND |

Education has played a vital role in Tanzania's development since independence, in 2007, Tanzania achieved nearly universal access to primary education.

However, since then, there has been a noticeable lag in educational quality, in both early grades and secondary schools. Reading proficiency is a concern, with only 5.4% of early-grade students reading with comprehension.

A significant number of teachers (66%) lack essential materials for teaching the basics (reading, writing, and arithmetic), and a majority of students (89%) attend classrooms without supplementary reading materials.

READ (Realizing Education for Development) strives to provide solutions to the challenges.


INTRODUCTION

Established as a result of the visionary efforts of READ International, which was founded in 2004 by a group of socially entrepreneurial students led by Rob Willison, READ aims to contribute to the improvement of the quality of education in Tanzania.

With a commitment to fostering conducive learning environments and improving literacy, READ's innovative initiatives are transforming the educational landscape across the nation.

1 Library Establishment and Refurbishment

Transforming underutilized spaces into vibrant libraries, we've successfully established 176 libraries in 22 regions of Tanzania.



2 Teacher's Professional Development

Empowering teachers through training in advanced teaching methodologies, effective textbook usage, and library management, we've reached 1,305 teachers.



3 Literacy Development and Reading Promotion Program

Fostering a reading culture through student-led reading clubs, we currently have 847,711 students in 111 schools as active participants.



4 E-Learning Program

Our e-learning program has been installed in 34 schools impacting more than 1,443 students and teachers.






5 Volunteers Mentorship Program

We create temporary employment for fresh graduates through our programs where graduates are offered the opportunity to practice their skills, sharpen their professional capabilities, and earn initial income while adding value to the education ecosystem. Moreover, this program enables READ Tanzania to enhance its initiatives through innovative and disruptive ideas and contributions of fresh and vibrant young professionals.

OUR STRATEGIC DIRECTION

Over the next decade, **READ Tanzania** is poised to adapt to the evolving educational landscape and the specific challenges surrounding literacy. Emerging technologies like artificial intelligence and the Internet of things are fundamentally reshaping how learning is both delivered and acquired. At READ Tanzania, we have established strategic objectives to ensure the pertinence of our future endeavors:

Enhance the availability and accessibility of digital and physical reading resources

READ Tanzania's primary focus is on improving the student-to-book ratio, aiming to transition from 4:1 to 1:1. Currently, in some public schools, a single book is shared by as many as 57 students. In partnership with existing collaborators and like-minded organizations, READ Tanzania will provide additional books to targeted schools and facilitate students' and teachers' access to both online and offline reading resources through the Soma Connect Platform.

Empower educators to achieve higher-quality outcomes

READ Tanzania is committed to enhancing teacher productivity by ensuring that educators receive in-service training focused on learner-centered techniques. This will be achieved through tailored workshops, teacher forums that will allow teachers to exhibit their best teaching approaches, and an exchange/exposure visits program that will be expanded to primary school teachers since we started with secondary school teachers.

Advocate for child protection, Gender awareness, and violence prevention education in the schools we support


READ Tanzania will prioritize the observance and implementation of child rights, addressing gender issues and violence prevention with specific attention to issues directly impacting the learning process, including bullying, sexual abuse, emotional abuse, and physical abuse.

Enhance teaching and learning infrastructures

Through collaboration with the government and like-minded stakeholders, **READ Tanzania** will work to improve teaching and learning environments. This will involve the construction and/or refurbishment of libraries and classrooms in targeted schools, with the aim of achieving a student-to-classroom ratio of 40:1. Additionally, will encourage RFAD Tanzania the implementation of WASH measures, including the construction of more latrines, to achieve a student-to-latrine ratio of 25:1 (Boys) and 20:1 (Girls) at primary schools, and 20:1 at lower secondary schools. So as to complement the creation of conducive reading environment were students have quality and equity education services.

Strengthen organizational systems and structures to ensure sustainability

READ Tanzania will concentrate on fortifying its existing system by reviewing and updating policies to align with universally accepted standards. Additionally, it will augment its human resources by either recruiting new staff or engaging part-time personnel for key positions such as Internal Auditor, Fundraising Officer, and Monitoring Evaluation and Learning (MEL) Officer. This strategic move is aimed at bolstering operations and delivering high-quality services to targeted schools and their local communities. READ will use monitoring, and evaluation data for learning and making a result-based decision that will contribute to improve the learning and teaching process both to students and teachers so as to improve access to educational resources for young people in Tanzania and support them in skills and capacity development.


